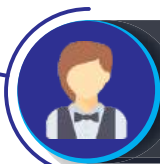

MISSIONS' IMPACT

In 2024, a total of 6,485 evangelistic and discipleship outreaches were conducted across primary, secondary, and post-secondary schools. Through these efforts, 489,858 pupils, students, and other young people were reached with the gospel and empowered to impact their communities for Christ. These engagements led to 55,317 decisions for salvation and 21,086 rededications.

In addition, 3,900 Associates and volunteers were reached through 339 visitations made to AFCS branches, and 8 retreats organised to provide an enriching fellowship and spiritual renewal for 378 senior friends, Associates and Volunteers.

Furthermore, 574 young people were reached during 14 sessions of the Singles' forum, resulting in 3 salvation decisions and 7 rededications. The Singles' Forum provided valuable guidance, peer sharing, and biblical perspectives on navigating relationships and life decisions.

During the annual World AIDS Day observance on December 1st, 6 awareness outreaches were conducted, reaching 560 individuals across FCS formations, with 4 people making decisions to follow Christ. The 2024 celebration highlights HIV/AIDS prevention, honouring lives lost to HIV/AIDS, and encourages care and treatment.

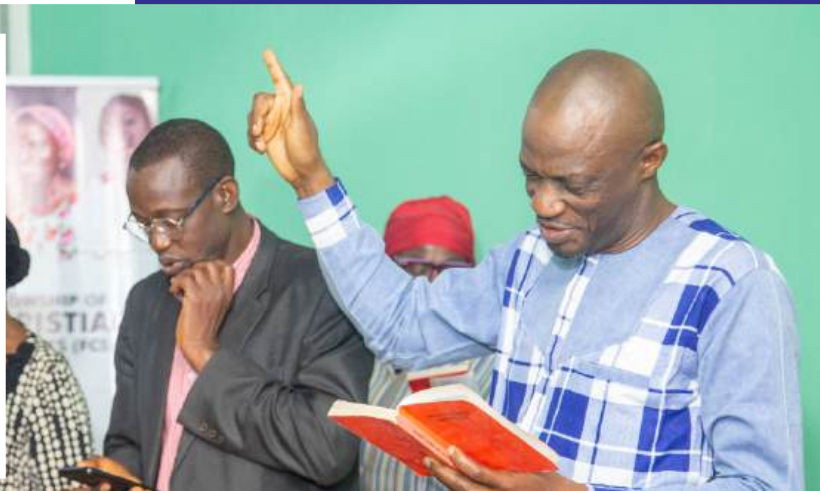

SCHOOL LEAVERS WORKSHOP

This workshop, designed specifically for secondary school leavers (SS3 Students), focuses on faith strengthening, career guidance, and navigating the challenges of higher education. A total of 5,853 SS3 students were reached in 106 workshops, and equipped with spiritual, academic, and life skills for facing their final exams and life after school. 775 of the attendees committed to joining the FCS team of school visitors (AFCS) after graduation.

CONFERENCES: GROUNDED IN TRUTH, TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD

Conferences remain one of our most powerful tools for evangelism and discipleship, creating space for deep engagement with the sound, undiluted Word of God. In 2024, we held 115 conferences across Nigeria, reaching 93,840 individuals with the life-changing message of the Gospel.

By God's grace, these gatherings led to 15,355 salvation decisions and 7,397 rededications to Christ. Each conference served as a spiritual milestone for countless young hearts, grounding them in truth and igniting a fresh passion for Christ. A highlight of the year was the 2024 National Conference in April—a hybrid event combining physical and virtual participation. The main centre was hosted at Government Science and Technical College, Bukuru, with 66 relay centres connected nationwide. The total attendance was 9,422 participants, including:

- 1,090 Primary School Children (JFCS)
- 5,485 Secondary School Students
- 1,544 Post-Secondary School Students
- 1,303 Associates and Senior Friends

The spiritual harvest was remarkable, with 1,419 individuals giving their lives to Christ and 351 others rededicating their lives to Him. Every session, message, and prayer based on the theme “Be careful how you build” (1 Corinthians 3:10) pointed to one goal: raising a generation anchored in Christ. Thank you for standing with us on this mission. Together, we are building lives that will stand the test of time.

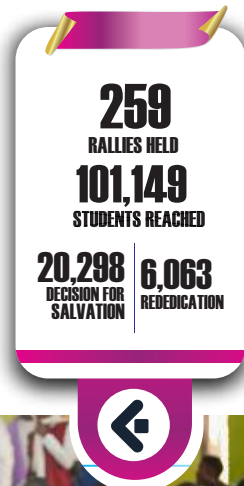

RALLIES

(ONE DAY CONFERENCE)

In 2024, 259 rallies were held across the FCS sub-zones and rally units, reaching 101,149 students with the Gospel. These efforts led to 20,298 salvation decisions and 6,063 rededications to Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour.

Rallies are organized every school term as a strategic platform to train and equip young people with the Word of God. Beyond spiritual teaching, these gatherings also empower participants with practical knowledge to help them succeed in life. Academic seminars and life skills training are key components of each rally, offering young people tools for personal growth and development. Through this holistic approach, the program promotes a balanced lifestyle, addressing both the spiritual and physical needs of the young people, helping them grow in faith while preparing them for life's challenges.

FILM OUTREACHES: SHARING THE LIGHT OF CHRIST THROUGH THE LENS

In 2024, our film outreach team took the gospel to the streets, schools, and churches, wherever people were willing to gather. Through 45 dedicated film outreaches, we reached an incredible 28,156 individuals with the message of hope and salvation in Christ. The impact was undeniable. From remote villages to bustling schoolyards, we saw hearts softened, lives changed, and communities awakened to the gospel. A total of 22,051 people responded to the call of salvation, choosing to follow Jesus and begin a new journey of faith. We're deeply grateful for every supporter, prayer partner, and volunteer who made this possible. Your partnership is helping us take the light of Christ to places where traditional preaching might never reach.

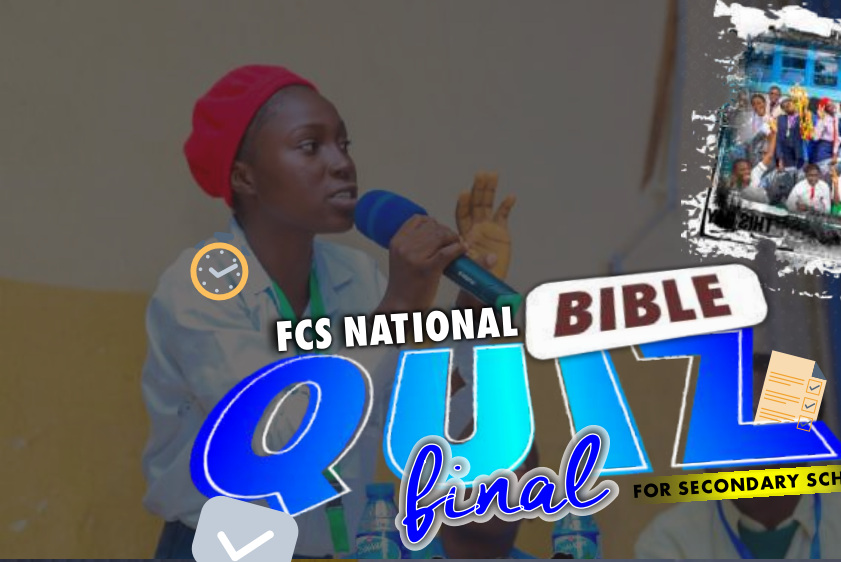

MEMBERSHIP & SUPPORT MOBILISATION, AWARENESS CAMPAIGN AND ADVOCACY

During the period under review, a total of 288 Awareness Campaigns were conducted in churches, and 589 persons made various commitments (praying, visiting schools and financial support) to partner with FCS in reaching the students. On campus, 98 Final Year students made a similar commitment. This initiative strengthens outreach efforts, ensuring sustained mentorship and discipleship for students. Additionally, 114 advocacies were made to church leaders, school owners, politicians, and key stakeholders to gain support for student discipleship, foster partnerships, and promote Christian values in the nation's educational system. During these advocacy visits, 217 leaders were reached with an effort to strengthen outreach, expand networks, and enhance the sustainability of faith-based student engagement.



The FCS Bible Quiz plays a significant role in providing student members with a platform to demonstrate their biblical knowledge on a national stage. It fosters both academic and spiritual growth, encourages a deeper understanding of FCS, promotes Christian unity, and inspires a culture of excellence in the Christian faith and living.

Leading up to the National Finals, 80 Bible Quizzes were conducted at the Zonal, State, and Area levels. The National Finals took place in Jos, from September 26th to 29th, 2024. The Grand finale was held at Rochas Foundation College, Jos, with 21 students from 7 Areas participating. The South West Mission Area emerged as the winner, followed by the Abuja Area in second place and the Nasarawa Area in third.



The finals were attended by 187 students from within Jos, with 45 Patrons, Associates and staff, including the National Director, and other Directors at the FCS National Headquarters. An additional 14,721 participants followed the event online. The event was well-coordinated under the leadership of Mr. Sunday Gomper, Chairman of the National Bible Quiz Committee. Distinguished guests on the occasion, include Prof. Stephen Akintunde (Chairman of the occasion), Mr. Timothy Adon, (a former National Director), and Dr. Mrs. Ekaete Ettang.

EMPOWERING THE NEXT GENERATION THROUGH LIFESKILLS

At the heart of the FCS mission is the goal of seeing children and youth equipped with essential psycho-social and livelihood skills, and empowered to live confident, healthy, and godly lives. FCS does this through her Lifeskills programme.

In 2024, a total of 536 Lifeskills sessions were conducted in Abuja Area (FCT, Kogi, Kwara, Niger), Adamawa Area (Adamawa, Taraba, Gombe), Nasarawa Area (Benue, Nasarawa, Plateau), Sokoto Area (Kebbi, Sokoto, Zamfara), South West and South East Mission Areas.

Impact report shows that 27,874 students were reached, and 2,259 made decisions to follow Christ out of these. These numbers represent lives being shaped, hope being restored, and futures being redefined. As we look ahead, we invite you to partner with us in expanding this life-changing programme. So



emotionally and spiritually. The spiritual impact report shows that 10 participants made first-time commitments to Christ while 20 rededicated their lives to Him. Besides these, they were stories of restored hope, renewed love, and strengthened marital commitment amongst participants.

LEADERSHIP AND COMMITTEE MEETINGS

Working with youths is an amazing experience. To impart and influence them positively, meetings play a crucial role. Meetings facilitate decision-making to advance the vision and mission of FCS. In 2024, we held two National Council sessions, in June and November, with a total of 78 attendees.

Additionally, there were 16 committee meetings at the Area levels with 147 participants, while at the state levels, there were 92 committee meetings with 1,425 attendees. Field reports indicated that 154 zonal committee meetings were held with 611 schools, and 130 AFCS Branches, involving 6,619 students and associates.

Furthermore, 3 State Aid4Life Committees were held with 21 attendance and 17 POSEC Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers meetings with 84 campuses and 360 students in attendance. We extend our gratitude to our stakeholders for their commitment to these meetings despite the current economic and security challenges in the nation.

STRENGTHENING FAMILIES. TRANSFORMING LIVES

that, together, we can raise a generation that builds stronger and godly families, communities, and nations. In FCS, we believe that strong families form the foundation of a thriving society. Through our Family Life Development Program, we are intentionally building healthy relationships, nurturing godly homes, and equipping couples to enjoy their marriages. In 2024, 12 impactful family life programs were held, reaching 127 participants through a variety of events, including Training of Counsellors, pre-marital counselling for intending couples, 'Enjoy your marriage' Couples' retreats, Singles' fora and Positive Parenting workshops.

In line with our best practices, the National POSEC Delegates meeting targeting the Presidents, Secretaries and Treasurers of each campus branch was held 24th-27th October 2024 at the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) Training Centre Rikkos, Plateau State. It was attended physically by 375 persons and 3,142 followed online.

RESTORING HOPE

In line with our mission to minister holistically to the individual and promote peaceful coexistence, FCS, through the generous support of some partners, carried out critical humanitarian and peacebuilding interventions in 2024. These efforts were not only acts of compassion but also seeds of lasting impact in the lives of individuals and communities that are facing pain, loss, and conflict.

HUMANITARIAN INTERVENTIONS

RELIEF FOR VICTIMS OF JOS SCHOOL BUILDING COLLAPSE

In response to the tragic collapse at All Saints Academy, Busa Buji, Jos, which claimed young lives and left many injured, FCS visited 25 affected students and their families. We provided cash support, beverages, and toiletries to ease their burden and assist with hospital expenses.

RELIEF FOR VICTIMS OF FLOOD IN MAIDUGURI

During the devastating floods in Maiduguri, 99 beneficiaries received cash-for-food assistance, helping them regain stability in a time of distress.

ADOPTION AND CARE FOR A VULNERABLE CONVERT

In a heartwarming testimony, Jumoke, a young girl who encountered Christ through a book published by FCS Mangu Zone, "This Love Thing," is now being cared for by the FCS Mangu Zone. Her physical and spiritual needs are being met through the loving support of the Christian community.

PEACE-BUILDING INITIATIVE IN SOUTHERN KADUNA

In regions once scarred by violence between herders and farmers, FCS is cultivating healing and dialogue. We launched two pilot Peace Clubs at GSS Manchok and GSS Zankan Moro'a (Kaura LGA, Kaduna State), empowering students as Peace Champions. These are youth committed to promoting unity and mutual respect across religious lines in their communities.

With each act of love, FCS is giving hope to wounded hearts and nurturing peace where once there was conflict. Your continued support makes this possible. Thank you!



INVESTING IN EDUCATION, SHAPING GODLY FUTURES

FCS is committed to building a generation of well-rounded learners, spiritually grounded, intellectually empowered, and morally upright. Our education initiatives in 2024 created platforms where pupils and students not only grew academically but also encountered Christ and strengthened in character.

HOLIDAY SCHOOLS: PREPARING MINDS AND HEARTS

During the 2024 vacation period, 15 Holiday School Centres were held, reaching 1,558 pupils and students with holistic learning. These sessions combined academic coaching with spiritual enrichment. 28 students gave their lives to Christ and 55 rededicated their lives to Him.

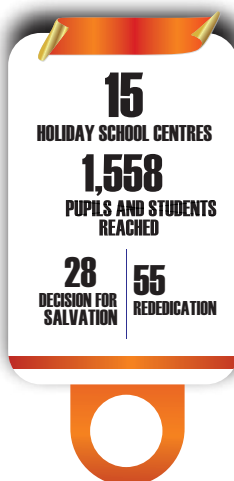
FIGHTING EXAMINATION MALPRACTICES

To promote integrity and discipline, FCS organized 49 seminars on examination malpractice, reaching 16,377 students across various schools and States.

Empowering Christian Teachers: Recognizing the critical role of educators in discipleship, 9 retreats were held for Christian teachers, with 161 participants, during these retreats 10 teachers committed their lives to Christ while 20 rededicated themselves to God for missions among the students.

JOHN DEAN ACADEMY: A BEACON OF GODLY EDUCATION

The FCS efforts at providing model schools that are centres of academic excellence and spiritual nurture have continued to thrive, with three standing campuses and two underway.



JOHN DEAN ACADEMY KURU

As of December 2024, has 96 pupils (from Reception to Primary 5), with 9 staff.

JOHN DEAN ACADEMY, KANGANG

Has 37 pupils (from Creche to Primary 4), with 6 staff

FCS ACADEMY, TAKUM

Has 187 pupils (Pre-nursery to Primary 5) and 81 students at the secondary level, with 13 staff. The campus is fully operational at its permanent site, with necessary facilities including a science laboratory, BECE Centre, Partial NECO Accreditation and Government Approvals and Incorporation Certificate.

In John Dean Academy, spiritual formation remains central: There is Weekly Fellowship on Fridays, Monthly and weekly fasting and prayers, Daily devotions using the Daily Milk, and Annual Career Day and Christmas Carol service.

Work is ongoing at John Dean Academy Makurdi and Jalingo campuses, with construction progressing steadily. Each child nurtured, each teacher empowered, and every classroom transformed is a testimony to your support and God's faithfulness. Together, we are raising children who will be agents of change in the next generation.



REPORTS FROM MISSION AREAS

The FCS Mission Areas cover the South-East, South-South, and South-West geopolitical regions of Nigeria, currently, FCS has a presence in 12 states out of 17. There are 135 secondary schools, 29 primary schools, 6 Post-Secondary (POSEC) branches, 19 Associates Fellowship of Christian Students (AFCS) branches and 16 zones.

In the year under review, the Mission Areas reached 42,804 students, pupils, Associates, and church members through 548 programs. As a result, 3,019 participants committed their lives to Jesus as their Lord while 983 participants rededicated their lives to Christ, and 117 individuals pledged to support the FCS.

Worthy of note is the “Devotional Clubs” being operated by FCS in three schools in Ile-Ife, Osun State, to help the students maximise the use of their devotionals. The Mission Areas require office space, volunteers, equipment, and means of transportation. Your further support will be a great help to them in this regard.

PARTNERSHIPS & COLLABORATIONS

In 2024, FCS strengthened and maintained our ongoing relationships with churches and other partners while exploring new partnerships at the National Area and State levels. We thank God for the invaluable support, in cash, materials and goodwill that we received from churches such as Victoria Fellowship Church, RCCN, CRC-N, Deeper Life Bible Church, ECWA, COCIN, ERCC, NKST (URCN), UMCA,

UEC, EYN, LCCN, Baptist, and the Church of Nigeria Anglican Communion, to mention but a few. Furthermore, FCS also enjoys collaborations with national and international organizations SU International, David Cook Ministry, Langham Preaching, FUSMO, Reach4Life, OneHope, Emmaus, NYSC, NIFES, Scripture Union Nigeria, Great Commission Movement of Nigeria, The Navigators, CAPRO, Peace House, NCCF, FCN, CRUDAN, RURCON, SUWA, ACET Nigeria among others. We paid visits to some of them and some also visited us.

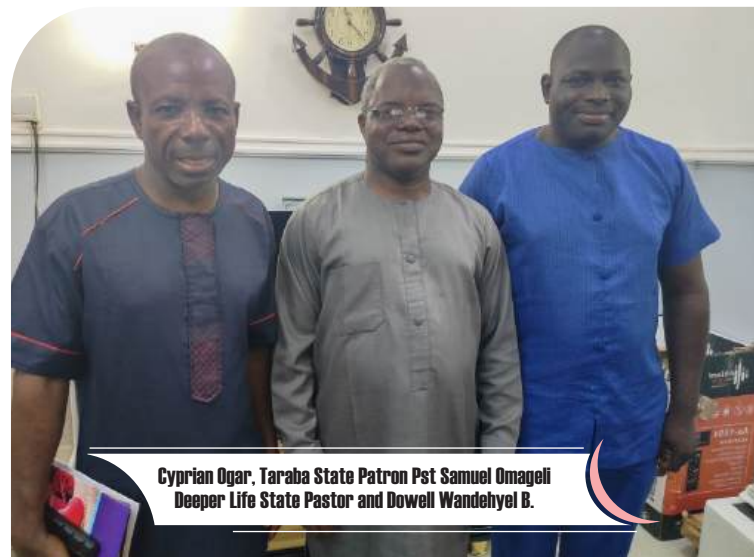

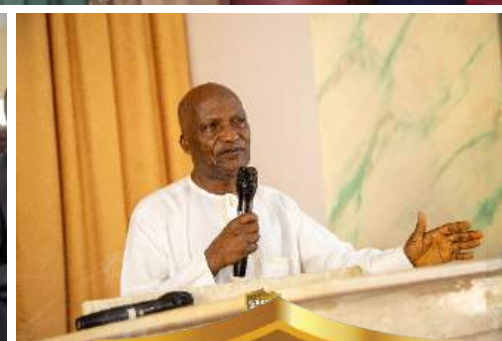

PROJECTS

In 2024, ongoing projects across FCS formations were at various stages of completion. In Borno State, the Mission House Project is 80% complete, with internal plastering, roofing, plumbing, electrical piping, window installation, and floor work completed. Tiling, painting, and burglary-proof installation are targeted for completion in 2025.

In the FCT, the state multi-purpose hall was completed and dedicated. Also, chapel constructions are ongoing in schools that have been given land allocation letters. These chapels are at various stages of construction – foundation, block work, lintel, and roofing level. In Kogi State, the development of FCS land has also commenced. In the Mission Areas, projects primarily focus on office and residential rent.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Equipping the staff, Associates and students is our priority. We build their capacities through training of trainers' workshops/retreats for school visitors, orientation of new staff, newly elected officials at various levels and student leaders. In the year under review, the following capacity buildings took place:

- 1. National And Area Executives Orientation:** This was focused on few strategic leaders who were intended to step down the training and equip other leaders under them in FCS formation. This was held from 7th-10th March 2024 at Miango Rest Home with 60 participants pooled across the country. FCS Management and some Associates facilitated the training.
- 2. Training on the use of accounting software:** Seven (7) Account staff, the National Director, the Director of Administration and Finance, and the National Treasurer were trained on QuickBooks from 22nd – 27th April 2024 at the National Headquarters, Jos.
- 3. Area/State Treasurers and Financial Secretaries Training:** To help promote uniformity in reporting within the FCS formations, 34 Area/State Treasurers and Financial Secretaries were trained from 1st – 4th February 2024.
- 4. Training of trainers on peace-building and substance abuse:** This was held from 19th – 23rd April 2024 for States Aid4life Chairmen, Training Secretaries and Aid for Life Directorate Staff with 20 persons in attendance.
- 5. New State Committee Orientations** were held in various states across Nigeria after the orientation at the National level. 254 State and Zonal officials participated.
- 6. Committee Training Course (CTC)**
This activity is centred on Leadership Development Skills. It is carried out to equip those who assume new leadership positions in FCS yearly. For the year 2024, we had 90 Committee Training Courses (CTCs) reaching out to 7,246 student leaders, out of which 1,564 souls accepted Jesus and 845 rededicated their lives.

7. **National Training on Creation Care and Disaster Response and Preparedness:** The depravity of man after the fall led to the destruction and disruption of the environment by his activities. To this end, FCS held this training for 18 participants in November at FCS National Headquarters.
8. **School visitors workshop:** 34 Training of Trainers (ToT) workshops/retreats were held, with 1,159 associates reached. These sessions aimed to enhance mentorship, discipleship, and leadership skills, ensuring impactful student engagement. The training provided practical tools for spiritual guidance, counselling, and academic support, strengthening outreach efforts.
9. **Workshop For Improving the Falling Standard of Education:** This workshop was organized to equip educators with effective teaching strategies, mentorship skills, and faith-based approaches to student development. **48 workshops were held, reaching 604 teachers and associates,** purposely to address the declining standard of education.
10. **Vocational Skills**

With the understanding of our target audience and the students transitioning into adulthood, FCS integrates skill training with biblical principles to foster financial independence, entrepreneurship, and ethical work practices. 17 workshops on entrepreneurship and crafts were held with 1,395 beneficiaries. These workshops prepare them for economic challenges and empower them to contribute meaningfully to society while maintaining strong Christian values.



SPECIAL PROGRAMMES

1. INAUGURATION OF THE NEW FCS NATIONAL DIRECTOR

The FCS family was deeply shaken by the sudden passing of our beloved National Director, Mr. Gideon M. Chimmin, on February 10, 2024. His departure left a great void in our hearts and in the leadership of the fellowship he served so faithfully. In response to this loss, and in keeping with the vision and continuity of the mission, the FCS National Council, during its session in June 2024, prayerfully appointed Mr. Philip Babarinde as the new National Director for an initial term of four years.

The inauguration ceremony was held on July 5, 2024, at the Government House Chapel, Rayfield, Jos. It was a solemn gathering that brought together dignitaries, church leaders, ministry partners, and members of the FCS family. A total of 175 people attended physically, while over 2,000 people joined virtually, reflecting the wide reach and deep affection the FCS community holds for its leadership. The event marked a significant moment in the history of FCS. We solicit your continual prayer for wisdom, strength, and grace for Mr. Babarinde as he leads the work of building lives for Christ, under God, in this new chapter of FCS history.



2. NATIONAL ALUMNI FORUM

In a strategic move to foster unity and collaboration among FCS alumni worldwide, a landmark meeting was held on June 22, 2024, bringing together the chairmen and secretaries of 15 Alumni Fellowship Groups. The purpose of the meeting was to create a cohesive national structure that would connect and coordinate the efforts of alumni fellowships, both locally and in the diaspora. At this meeting, a five-member committee was constituted to serve as the National Alumni Coordinating Team.

The team is led by **Prof. Pwaveno Bamaiyi as Chairman**, with **Mr. Danladi Wana serving as Secretary**. These leaders bring

with them a wealth of experience and a deep commitment to the FCS vision. The official inauguration of the team took place during a special session organized by FCS Management from September 20–21, 2024. This significant step marks a new chapter in FCS alumni engagement, creating a strong platform for partnership and collaboration across generations. We look forward to greater synergy as alumni unite to build and support the work of FCS in Nigeria and beyond.

3. INAUGURATION OF EDITORIAL COMMITTEE:

To help the Fellowship edit her materials devoid of errors, the Fellowship inaugurated a twenty-three-member committee in April 2024 with Dr. (Mrs.) Lydia Lakan as Chairman and Pastor James Okpenge U. as the Secretary.

4. INTER-CAMPUS FELLOWSHIP

Within the period of reporting, we had 6 Inter-Campus Fellowship to unite Christian students across institutions for spiritual growth, mentorship, and leadership development. With 864 reached, 80 surrendered their lives to Christ and 100 rededications. The program fosters faith-based networking, discipleship, and collaborative outreach, equipping students to navigate campus life with biblical principles while strengthening their commitment to evangelism and Christian service.



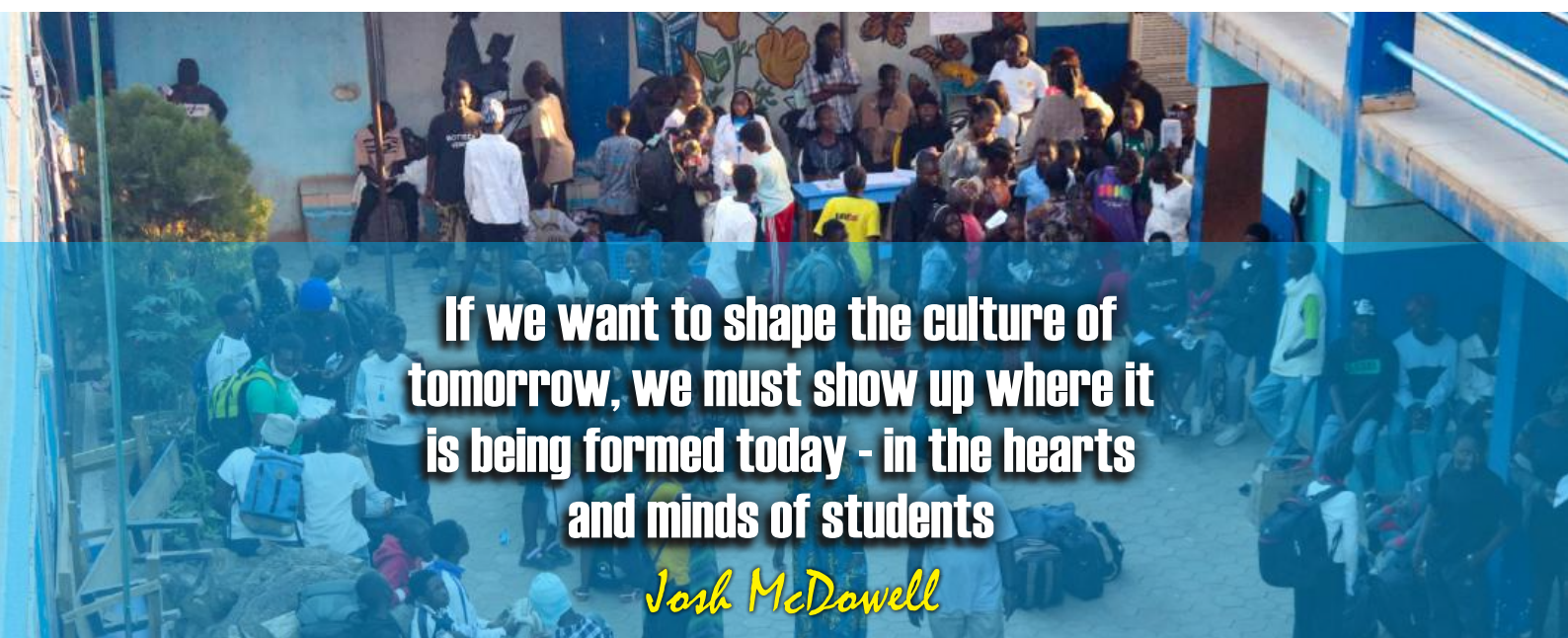
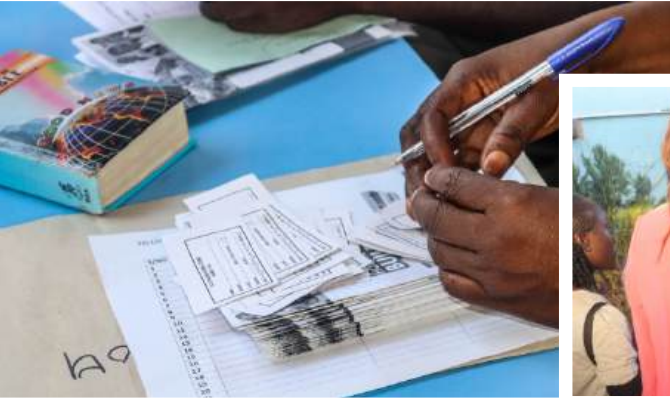
5. BROTHERS/SISTERS WEEKEND PROGRAMS:

6. SISTERS' FORUM:

The forum provided a safe space for mentorship, spiritual growth, and discussions on identity, self-worth, relationships, and career development from a biblical perspective.

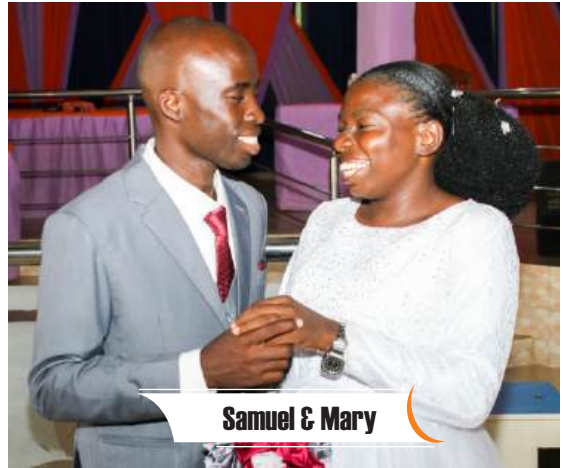

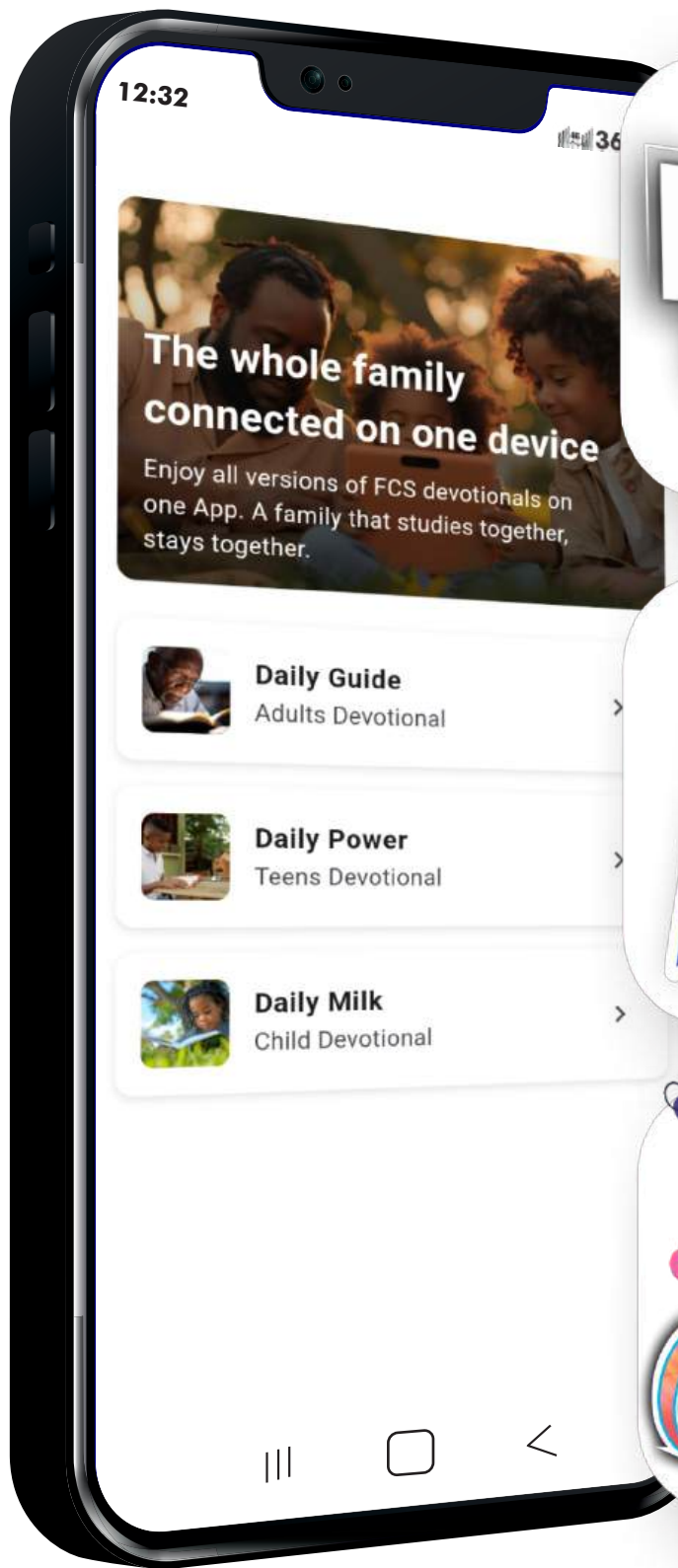
