

Never allow distractors take your mind away from this fountain that is about breaking forth and also don't be a distraction to anybody.


Note! Qualitative leadership is born out of a loaded heart who has intentionally eaten well under the master.

BIBLE STUDY

THEME: Godly Arrows: Forged for Impact, Called to Lead

Text: Psalm 127:1-5

Memory Verse: Psalm 127:4-5 - Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are sons born in one's youth. Blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them. They will not be put to shame when they contend with their enemies in the gate. (NIV)

STUDY 1: GODLYARROWS – FORGED FOR IMPACT

Introduction

Although God uses men to accomplish His divine purposes on earth, He is never in a hurry to bring anyone into spiritual leadership. No matter how urgent the need for leaders in His work, God never becomes anxious to hurriedly send out unprepared, untrained, and unrefined men into His service. Instead, He takes time to prepare every vessel that he will use, just as a warrior carefully forges, sharpens, and polishes his arrows before going to the battle.

The fact that God requires **godly arrows** implies that there are also **ungodly arrows** in Satan's hands, which he uses to kill, steal, and destroy (John 10:10) in the ongoing battle between light and darkness. Our goal in this study, therefore, is to understand the ongoing battle, to know the kind of men God uses to fight, and to allow Him to prepare us to be men that He can use to fight the enemies at the gates. This, He did with Moses, John the Baptist, Paul, and even our Lord Jesus. In God's economy, preparation comes before placement. Men are made to make others, prepared to prepare others, and impacted to impact others. If we are going to make a lasting impact and advance His kingdom in our generation, our case cannot be different. As we study together, may none of us miss out in the place of preparation, in Jesus' name. Amen.

Discussion Questions

- 1. **Differentiate between godly and ungodly arrows** using Psalm 1:1–2 and 2 Timothy 3:12–13.
- 2. Identify other names or symbols for godly arrows from these Scriptures: 2 Timothy 2:21; 1 Peter 2:9; Isaiah 41:15; Obadiah 21; Jeremiah 51:20; Joel 2:2.7.
- 3. Discuss the process God uses to forge and prepare His arrows for impact. (Mark 3:13–14; 2 Timothy 2:15; Ephesians 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:17; Isaiah 49:2).
- **4. Examine how God prepared these Bible characters for their assignments**—Moses, Esther, Elisha, Paul, and David. What can we learn from each of them? Support your answers with Scriptures.

Conclusion

Failure to undergo the process of divine preparation often leads to spiritual dullness and ineffectiveness. Arrows that are not sharpened or trimmed cannot be useful to the Master.

God desires to build His Church through prepared vessels who will advance His purposes in schools, churches, and marketplaces. Can God depend on you as His arrow-forged, shaped and sharpened?

STUDY 2:

GODLYARROWS-CALLED TO LEAD

Text: Acts 20:25-35

Memory Verse: Acts 20:28 - Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God (NIV)

Introduction

Everything rises and falls on leadership. A leader can inspire, influence, and mobilise others to achieve meaningful goals, and vice versa. The reason God forges and prepares us, as discussed in study one, is to provide true leadership for His people and His work in our generation.

However, a call to leadership is a call to service. The hallmark of true leadership and service in God's Kingdom is faithfulness (1 Cor. 4:2). God is seeking men and women who are faithful in what is least, faithful with material things, faithful in handling His word and His people. This begins with self-leadership through discipline, integrity, and a heart to serve.

In this study, we will discuss God's mandates on those he has called and prepared as His vessels in this end-time, as well as the place of self-leadership in fulfilling those mandates. May the Holy Spirit illuminate our hearts and minds as we study His Word together. Amen.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Discuss from these Scriptures how leadership begins with the leader: Acts 20:28, 33–35; 1 Peter 5:2–3; 1 Samuel 12:2–5.
- **2. God never calls anyone without a purpose.** Discuss God's purpose for calling leaders from these Scriptures: Ephesians 4:11-15; John 4:34; John 9:4; 2 Timothy 3:17; 2 Timothy 2:21; 1 Timothy 6:12.
- 3. What are God's expectations from those He has called into leadership? Colossians 1:28; Matthew 5:13-16; 2 Timothy 4:2; John 4:35; Matthew 28:19-20.
- 4. Identify and discuss the practical steps we must take to fulfil our calling as God's end-time arrows (leaders) on our campuses, from these Scriptures: Isaiah 60:1–2; Matthew 5:15–16; Luke 12:35; Ephesians 5:8, 13–18; Micah 2:10; Deuteronomy 2:24–25.

Conclusion

Godly leaders are spiritual leaders. Only those who are led by the Spirit can lead for God. Such leaders are men and women of integrity, character, vision, humility, and wisdom. They inspire others, make decisive choices, initiate change, and remain humble regardless of achievement or position. Are you such a leader? What decision and commitment are you making as a result of this study? Turn to God in prayer. Call on Him to shape, sharpen, and strengthen you to be His arrow, who will make an indelible impact in your generation.

You shall not disappoint God in your generation in Jesus' name.
