

# DEAR FRIENDS AND SUPPORTERS OF FCS

inally, the maiden edition of *FCS Annual Report* is here, after discarding numerous drafts. FCS is implementing an unusual strategy – combining the radical, local initiatives and dynamism of a movement with the organised, disciplined yet vibrant structure of an organisation. Running them together has been quite demanding – promoting local initiatives and structuring such into a system – takes quite some doing.

You may notice some of these challenges in our Report. Most contents cover national events or happenings at the headquarters, while most of our work happens at school branches, or the grassroots where our children – pupils, students and scholars-operate. We are not in any way belittling their efforts. It is just the reality of our context, especially as we have the highest concentration of senior Staff at the Head office, where they coordinate and collate all these efforts.

For a national youth broad-based organisation like ours, it is easier to identify and state what an Annual Report omits than what it includes. Please bear with us, especially for our donors/sponsors and contributors who may seem unappreciated. Most sponsors of activities and programmes do so silently and do not wish to be recognised, and often do not even document their expenses, since they are doing it "unto the Lord". Thus, financial reports have not been included. However, we deeply appreciate your inputs in cash, in kind or in person. We hope to improve subsequently.

The year 2022 was one of the longest for FCS. At a point it seemed some extra days, weeks or even months were slotted in-between the calendar lists. There was the COVID-19 hangover that refused to go away. And the approaching national political elections in Nigeria with the accompanying tensions of expectations, the long-drawn fuel crisis, the impossible gallop in inflation amidst extreme scarcity and mass poverty, currency change crisis, the loss of an entire academic session in schools due to lecturers strikes, insecurity, banditry, kidnapping, surge in violence and criminality nationwide and killings by unknown gun-men or "ungun known men", which have all become synonyms for each other.

FCS had quite some brushes with extreme difficulties and constraints, even deaths and bereavements: such as the demise of our former Grand Patron and Trustee-designate, retired Chief Justice of Benue State, and one-time FCS Benue State Chairman, the late HON JUDGE IORHEMEN HWANDE! The National Director, Gideon M. Chimmin, was briefly hospitalised in October. And the Secretary of the Board of Trustees, MR INUWA K. BAHAGO, proceeded to India for a six-month treatment, which ended well

### FCS IN BRIEF

FCS is an evangelical interdenominational Ministry reaching children and youth in primary schools, secondary and Post-Secondary (POSEC) institutions all over Nigeria.

Formally inaugurated 14th December, 1957, the Ministry focuses mainly on evangelizing and discipling students for Christ, training them for leadership, and equipping them for life and service in school and after graduation. After school, they may join the Associate Fellowship of Christian Students (AFCS), where they continue in Fellowship and are trained to support the ministry as well as join in visiting students and pupils in schools or organising training and camps for them.

FCS also produces and procures/or distributes Bible, Bible study outlines and Bible reading notes and also operates a Book Centre at the National Headquarters. We also have Aid4Life programme that educate people on how to curb Health and health-related issues, build capacity of young people and families with requisite skills to cope with psychosocial challenges through life skills education, awareness, and consultancy services.



### **AIMS AND OBJECTIVES**

#### The aims and objectives of the Fellowship are:

- (1) To reach students and youths for Christ and perfect them in godliness.
- (2) To deepen personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ among members, and to help them to see the relevance of their faith to their studies and life as a whole.
- (3) To encourage personal Bible Study and Prayers, to provide opportunities for Group Bible Study and Prayers, and to organize conferences.
- (4) To encourage each member to have a personal concern for others and to witness through their practical Christian living and through their words.
- (5) To encourage responsible church membership.
- (6) To produce and or procure and distribute Christian literature and audiovisual materials.
- (7) To be involved in HIV/AIDS, other pandemics and related disease conditions advocacy in schools, churches and communities towards eradicating the scourge in schools, the Church and the larger society.
- (8) To create awareness, educate, train and disciple members in relation to family life, lifeskills development etc in order to promote Christian values in homes and equip young people with requisite skills to live competently and confidently in a complex society.
- (9) To establish vocational and psycho-social skills development centres for orphans and vulnerable children and their care givers, and/or to provide support to orphans and vulnerable children and their care givers in order to develop and use their talents, skills and opportunities.
- (10) To establish schools and other educational institutions that will provide educational training for members and the larger society.
- (11) To establish any business venture that may provide opportunities for the development of entrepreneurial skills by students and youths and generate income for sustenance of the organisation.

od's Word is the most reliable tool in bringing transformation. So, one of the strategies FCS uses for the discipleship of students is Bible Reading Promotion. Bible Quiz is used in promoting Bible engagements especially among Secondary School students. Each year Bible Quizzes are held at all levels with a grand finale at the National Headquarters.

In 2022, Abuja Area emerged the overall best with a cumulative of 78.5 points, while Nasarawa Area came second with 77.5 points and Sokoto Area came third with 75 points. Prizes were awarded to the Areas as well as individual participants. These include Bibles, medals, trophies and other Christian literature and certificates. We appreciate you for making 2022 National Bible Quiz a success. We pray that God will mobilize more supporters for the Quiz at all levels. Let's make it a reality again this year.

Quiet time (personal devotion) is a strategy and discipline to develop and encourage personal Bible reading, reflection and prayer. To enhance this, we produce Bible Reading Notes that are appropriate for all ages. **Daily Milk** for children of primary school age, **Daily Power** for young people especially of secondary school age and **Daily Guide** for Adults believers. In 2022, more than 30% of the Daily Guide produced were sold at loss largely because of late printing and low

involvement of some of our Associates/School visitors in the distribution of these discipleship

materials. For obvious reasons we have need of a Printing Press which will enhance production and distribution of our discipleship materials.













a. FAMILY WORSHIP CENTRE, ABUJA has been one of

the major and regular financial supporters of FCS work for nearly 30 years. Thank God for the Senior Pastor, Mrs. Sarah Omakwu, and the Church leadership have remained focused in the vision of encouraging missionaries and widows from different backgrounds

b. We have a cordial relationship with TEKAN Churches. FCS presents reports at their General Assembly every year.

We pray that more Churches, Para-Church organisations and families will be drawn by God to partner with us to pursue this mission. Thank you all for your continuous support and partnership.

- c. Other Churches like Victoria Fellowship Church, Lekki, Lagos; ECWA; Deeper Life Bible Church; UMCA; Church of Nigeria (Anglican Communion); UEC, CEFN and many others supporting FCS work with financial support, releasing their facilities to us for programmes, motivating their members to join the work force and praying.
- d. Some para-Church organisations that partner with FCS include David Oyedapo Ministry International (DOMI); Children Evangelism Ministry (CEM), Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF), Voice of the Christian Martyrs, The Gideons International, Nigeria Evangelical Missions Association (NEMA); Peace House, Gboko; Nigerian Christian Corpers Fellowship (NCCF), Pentecostal Fellowship of Nigeria (PFN); Christian Association of Nigeria (CAN); David Cook Ministries, ONE HOPE International, EMMAUS Bible Centre, Jos, World Link International Ministries, USA; School's Chapels, Gospel Bankers, Warri, etc are not left out in our partnership work.
- e. SCRIPTURE UNION MEETING: Scripture Union International Group 5 annual meeting held in Accra, Ghana in July 2022. FCS National Chairman and Director could not attend due to unforeseen challenges of COVID-19 protocols. But FCS was represented by the former National Post-Secondary Schools Secretary (Bro. Joel Choji). We thank God for its fruitfulness and journey mercy. The meeting discussed several practical issues in youth ministry and reviewed some training topics on same.

f. COLLEGE OF PRAYER INT. USA: The College of Prayer International was founded in 1997 by Fred Hartley III and three other pastors who were mentored by Armin Gesswein. God has called the College of Prayer to rebuild the Upper Room in every nation of the world. The vision goes beyond prayer that revives the church—we want to see unreached people receive the good news of Christ.

Since the commencement of prayer cell known as upper rooms in March 2020 by College of Prayer, the partnership has been maintained. FCS Management and some key field staff have been having monthly online mentoring meetings with the US Head office. Two of their representatives facilitated the second level training for FCS Senior staff in March 2022 at Jos (ECWA Good News Church, Dadi Kowa, Jos south.

### **INFRASTRUCTURE**

#### a. NATIONAL CAMPSITES

The need for these at all levels increases due to difficulty to get adequate venues for conferences, rallies, leadership development, camps and other meetings. To minimize these challenges, we have encouraged campsites procurement.

We procured the Right of Occupancy for our National Campsite size of 22.07 Hectares at Barkin Ladi, Jos, Plateau State. The building project work of a story building on the site stopped after decking the first floor due to low inflow of funds partly due to reoccurring security crisis in the surrounding communities..

In view of this reoccurring crisis then, Council directed in 2020 for another campsite to be acquired for development. A 15



Hectare land in Karu, Nasarawa state, near Abuja was acquired with borrowed money to avoid missing the opportunity. To settle the debt incurred in the purchase, documentation and demarcation will cost N45million.

We invite you to join in the effort to defray this cost to offset the outstanding debt and process the land document before this year runs out (ie 2023).

The strategies adopted in raising money for these campsites' development include:

- 1. Each student is expected to contribute 2 Blocks or its equivalent of N600.00 yearly.
- 2. Each Associate/ Staff/Senior Friend/ patron/ well-wisher to contribute at least 10 blocks or its equivalent of N3,000 yearly.

Sadly, the response to the above has not been encouraging. However, we appreciate God for the progress made and being made so far in our formations due to your sacrificial contributions. We trust God for more material and financial interventions to complete the projects.

## b. NATIONAL DIRECTOR'S RESIDENTIAL

ACCOMMODATION: The National Director moved to his official residential apartment at

Rantya, Jos after the first stage of the renovation. We are trusting God for more money to complete the work. Outstanding: water reticulation, guard house, fence and gate.

- **c. FCS NATIONAL SECRETARIAT** is yet to be completed. Plastering, painting and land scaping is pending works due to lack of funds.
- d. OUR BUILDING PROJECTS AT DIFFERENT LEVELS OF COMPLETION ACROSS FCS FORMATIONS:
- 1) FCS **Bauchi state** dedicated part of their Secretariate in April, 2022.
- 2) FCS Plateau State has gone far with the House in Jos.
- 3) Benue State is done with the State House in Makurdi but



they still need fund for perimeter fencing of the land. Efforts are ongoing to commence John Deans Academy. They also need a house in Otukpo for the Second Missionary field staff (TS) in the State.

- 4) **Nasarawa state** Secretariat is in use. However, the State has another Training Secretary based at Keffi to enhance the coordination of the work to cope with increasing schools in the State each year.
- 5) **Zamfara State** has bought a land and trusting God to start developing soon.
  - 6) **Kebbi State** built a small apartment some years back. They hope to build a fence for protection.
  - 7) Kano State laid foundation for their Secretariat in 2022 but has not progressed since then.
  - 8) Gombe State has a twin flat at the Secretariat. One serves as Guest House and office and one hosts the family of the Training Secretary. Currently they are building a hall for meetings that has reached lintel level.
  - 9) Taraba State Mission House is almost completed, remaining painting and perimeter fencing. Also, a six classroom structure was



- 10) FCS John Dean Academy, Takum **Taraba State:** We bless the name of the Lord for the successful 10<sup>th</sup> Year Anniversary/graduation ceremony of FCS Academy, Takum on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2022. The school Examination Hall and two rooms structure has been raised to a window level at the permanent site. Let's pray for more funds to complete the project and gain approval for a WAEC Exam Centre.
- 11) **Yobe Area** bought a three-bedroom flat in Damaturu. They are planning to dig a bore hole and renovate the fence.









### ACTUMULIES IN SPOTLIGHT

(a) SCHOOL VISITATIONS: This is one of the core activities of FCS operations. School visitors comprise of Associates, Staff, other volunteers, Christian teachers and even post-secondary (POSEC) students especially. the evangelical wing of the fellowships. In the year under review,

Also, 180 visits were made to POSEC in 2022 and 13,773 students

attended. 4,463 and 228 of them gave their lives to Christ and recommitment respectively. 6 orientations on evangelism and discipleship were carried out and 588 POSEC students participated.

One good practice in POSEC is POSEC Inter-campus Fellowship where branches with close proximity do have combined services once a session. Such activities held in 10 campuses with a total of 405 in attendance. 39 students gave their lives to Christ.



(b) CONFERENCES AND CAMPS: National Post-Secondary Students

(POSEC) Leadership Retreat held on 20th-23rd October at Deeper Life

Bible Ministry Plateau State Headquarters, Zaramangada, Jos, Plateau State with 448 registered students' leaders in attendance and 64 of them put their trust on Jesus as Lord. Over all 93 conferences held across FCS formations with 31,834 out of which 6,377 put their trust in Jesus to save them from their sins, while 2,487 rededicated their commitment to the Lord. These event featured: Bible Studies, talks, academic and marriage seminars, workshops, drama presentations, praise and prayer night.

**CONSULTATION:** This held August 26<sup>th</sup> to September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 at the National Headquarters in Jos and with focus on TRAUMA HEALING.

(e) AID FOR LIFE: A new National Aid for Life (aid4Life) Board under the Leadership of Dr. Mrs. Rhoda Udanyi was inaugurated 26th May, 2022. Other members include Mr. Zakka Ali (Director of aid4Life) Secretary, Gideon M. Chimmin (National Director), Mrs. Nankling Nyinebi (National Treasurer), Evang. Godwithus Abolaji (Director of Schools), Danlami Bitrus Otsa (Director of Mission and Associates), Mrs Tassie Ghata, Mrs. Jennifer R. Tanko and Rev.

Mancha Dorong.

#### (f) TALK SPORTS, TALK YOUTH:

Sport has a grip on young people and is a neutral tool which can either make or mar. We have started exploring the possibilities of discipleship through sports.

I. Sports and Play activities are inculcated at FCS Conferences to get the attention of the students.

ii. TOTALFIT known as Health and

Fitness holds thrice a week at the National Office, Jos. iii. ReadySetGo multiply School: Three coaches from FCS were successfully trained and certified at Abuja by ReadySetGo. Coach Jeremy Yaluna Yieljep, coach Sadiya Mohammed Filimon and coach Grace Ali Zakka. Master Coach Manasseh Elisha were inaugurated as a Sport Chaplain in the closing ceremony at Abuja.

FCS National Chairman Dr. Ndam Considering the increasing rate of family first time. 5 functional peer pressure crises even in Christian homes, plus declining emphases on Biblical values about family, we encourage each FCS formation to give attention to family life activities. Within the year of review, 13 Parent-Child Communication Fora held. 13 marriage seminars and family life relationships held with 1,252 persons attended.

- (h) SINGLES CORNER: 32 sessions of Singles forum and seminars were carried out at branch and church levels reaching 13,928 singles under the year under review.
- (I) VALENTINE DAY: FCS takes advantage of Special Days like Valentine. In 2022, 16,050 youth were reached through seminars, picnics and other varieties in 224 locations. This was to add value to life for young people who see Valentine Day as a day in which immorality is allowed. 1,105 beneficiaries had redirection of attitudes to celebrate Valentine in a godly manner and made commitment to honour God with their bodies.

#### (j) HOLIDAY SCHOOL PROGRAMME:

The number of 'drop outs' and 'failures' in schools were on the increase year after year. Very often during holidays, students are left to roam around on streets and to engage in all sorts of social vices such as violence, drug abuse, cultism, theft, sexual promiscuity. So, in 1996 FCS initiated Holiday School aimed at equipping the students academically, morally and spiritually. This holds for 5 to 6 weeks at Zonal Levels to help prepare the students for the next Academic Session. In 2022, 1,038 students participated in the Holiday School and 66 of them put their trust in Jesus to save them from

(k) LIFESKILLS: 4,715 students benefitted in Life-skills programmes 41 contacts at primary, secondary and POSEC including church communities. 15 awareness campaigns on drug abuse were carried out at schools' branch level to 1.217 students. 12 of these children put their trust in Jesus Christ for the clubs with 150 members are on-going at secondary schools.

#### (I) HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE: 2

visits were made in Benue State reaching 320 parents and 1,450 primary and secondary schools' students at IDP camp, Daudu, North Bank Development Area. One of the visits was made with the Joseph Sarwan Tarka University, Makurdi (JOSTUM) POSEC students. Six bags of fairly used and new cloths, sanitary pads, bathing soups and others were distributed.

Secondly, 2 orphanages and two families benefitted in FCS humanitarian response in Jos in February, 2022. Tabitha Orphanage at Millionaire's Quarters and Manginigi Orphanage, Rukuba Barracks Road, Bassa Local Government of Plateau State: 14 bags of rice, 5 carton of Spaghetti, 3 carton of magi seasoning, 2 bags of salt, 2 bags of detergents, 1 ½ bag of sugar 6 cartons of washing and toilet soaps were distributed.

FCS Rapid Response also put a smile in the face of a woman and her two kids who were staying in the mining pit behind Paul Gindiri's Quarry Site, Zarmaganda Jos South. FCS enrolled the children back to school, provided them with food stuff and pay a house rent and other necessary basic home items were given to them.

(m) CAPACITY BUILDING AND **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT:** One of the key components of FCS Mission Statement is providing leadership training/development to her members.













This is carried via leadership courses, "Committee Training Course (CTC)". In 2022, we captured 196 sessions of CTC at secondary schools; 68 at branch level of POSEC besides the National POSEC Leadership Retreat where all POSEC leaders from tertiary institutions meet for central training. 6,838 and 1,921 students participated at secondary and POSEC levels with total of 1,146 and 4 leaders put their trust in Jesus for the first time.


(n) FCS MEDIA Media Unit at the National Office Jos organised 3 weeks teens training on basic ICT skills in August, 2022. Contents covered were digital literacy (getting started with computer, introduction to Basic Computer application/software, care and maintenance of a personal computer, emailing, introduction to computer best practices and programming and basic search operation) cyber security and data safety, innovations and graphic designs. This was aimed at grooming our young people to face the current trend of computer based external examination introduced in all national examinations. 16 teenagers and children participated.

The unit also purchased a D5 Mark III still camera, Dell laptopn (5580 Latitude) and a gift of 1TB Dell studio Desktop within the period of reporting. It is your support that makes these possible. 

#### **COUNSELLING AND ADVOCACY**

CHURCH AWARENESS was carried out in 114 churches reaching 5,742 members. 122 made commitments to pray for FCS, or to join the AFCS while some promised to support FCS financially. Also, 7 Associates Retreats and 2 FCS Reunion fellowships held with 322 and 178 participants respectively. In order to re-enforce the capacity of school visitors and Christian teachers, 9 workshops for school visitors and 5 Teachers Summits were conducted. 149 school visitors and 383 Christian Teachers attended.

12 new AFCS branches were formed with 353 members. Pray that these groups will grow to reproduce themselves. Alumni meetings held in 9 tertiaries institutions with 336 former fellowship members in attendance.

'Catch them young' is one slogan FCS believes in. This is done via School Leavers Workshops for graduating Senior Secondary School students to introduce them to the Associates Fellowship of Christian Students (AFCS). They are encouraged to join the AFCS while waiting for admission to tertiary institutions. 46 of those workshops held with 5,583 higher school students in attendance. 554 of them confessed Jesus as Lord and Saviour for the first time while 45 rededicated their lives. 182 graduating SS3 students promised to join the school visitation team. Final Year Brethren (FYB) fellowships held at various POSEC branches.

110 State/Zonal ExCo & State Committee meetings with 3,118 attendances, 44 found new faith in Jesus and 31 renewed their commitment. Also, 12 Area Committee and 2 National Council meetings held.





### FCS GRAND PATRON

Most Rev. Henry Chukwudum Ndukuba was elected FCS Grand Patron in November, 2021. Most Rev. Ndukuba attended Bishop Shanahan College, Orlu and had his WASC in 1978. He worked in Kano State Library, Ministry of Education 1979–1980. He attended the Theological College of Northern Nigeria from 1980 and obtained a B.D. in 1984. He did his NYSC in Kano State 1984–1985. He obtained MA in Systematic Theology, from Durham University, England, 1990 and another in Christian Education at Princeton Theological Seminary in 1996. He won the John Havran's Princeton Prize for Christian Education, New Jersey.

He was ordained into the Deaconate in 1984 by Bishop B.B. Ayam at the age 23 and to the priesthood in 1985. He became Canon in 1989 at the age of 28 and an Archdeacon in 1992 at the age 31. He served in St George's Anglican Church, Borupai, Kano. Thereafter, he lectured at St. Francis of Assisi Theological College, Wusasa, Zaria in 1985, where became the Acting Dean.

After other numerous responsibilities, on 21 September 1999, he was consecrated as the first Bishop of the Diocese of Gombe, at the aged of 38 years old. Bishop Henry worked with Luke Partnership for Scriptural

Translation, Luke Initiative for Scripture Translation (LIST), Nigeria Bible Translation Trust (NBTT) and "Seed Company" to produce literacy materials and translate the Bible and Jesus film into 10 of the 17 tribal languages of Gombe State.

He became Chairman of the Liturgy and Spirituality Committee of the Church of Nigeria (Anglican Communion) whose responsibility is to produce the "Annual Bible study manual and Daily Fountain devotional, Sunday School Manuals and Youth devotionals.

He is the BOT Chairman of Luke Initiative for Scripture Translation, the registered body working on the translation of the Bible, the "Jesus Film" and Literacy materials in Nigerian languages especially minority languages in Nigeria.

He is a biblical scholar, teacher, master liturgist, pastor and an accomplished evangelist. He is also a prolific writer.

On 24 September 2019, he was elected Archbishop, Metropolitan and Primate of All Nigeria at the Episcopal Synod of the Church of Nigeria (Anglican Communion) in Asaba, Delta State. On 25 March 2020, he assumed office as the **Primate of Nigeria**, and the Bishop of Abuja, taking over from Designation Nicholas Okoh.

### MISSION AREAS

FCS Mission Area comprising of South East, South-South, South West. Work has been ongoing over 10 years starting from Ogoja, Cross Rivers State. Today, we have FCS presences across the southern Nigeria. In South East, FCS is in Enugu State with 3 Zone, 6 AFCS branches, FCS branches in 5 secondary schools and 10 JFCS at primary schools. Despite troubling insecurity, 39 evangelistic and discipleship visitations were made to primary schools with 1,964 pupils and 1,000 children confessed Jesus as their Lord, secondary with 49 attendance and 18 putting their trust on Jesus and AFCS branches with 180 Associates in attendance. Bible Club is a hinge for FCS work in Enugu State 24 Bible clubs were reached with 2,083 young people and 268 persons made decision for Jesus.

5 trainings held with 16 student leaders reached and Life-skills reach 2,013 persons and **o**ne church awareness was carried out with 203 persons reached in 2022.

In South-south Mission Area, partnership with churches and schools are growing gradually. Relationship with Ministry of Education gaining recognition. South-South Mission Area comprises of 6 states with 3 functional Zones, 3 AFCS branches in Cross River and Rivers States, 3 POSEC, FCS in 62 secondary schools and 6 JFCS at primary schools' level. 11 evangelistic and discipleship visitations were made to JFCS branches reaching 1,065 pupils. 35 of such visits were carried out to FCS branches reaching 2,697 students with 12 confessing Jesus as Lord for the first time. Two new FCS branches established with 550 members. 2 outreaches made to POSEC branches with 350 students in attendance with 5 making decisions to follow Jesus Christ.

3 sessions of Committee Training Course (CTC)/ Leadership Training held with 89 students' leaders in attendance and 7 of them entrusted Jesus Christ with their lives to save them from sins. Also, 2 Life-skills contacts held with 15 students' participants. Lastly, 2 Holiday school centres organized with 79 pupils/students reached in South-south in 2022.

South West Mission Area: The situation in all the states in the Area was relatively peaceful, except for the declaration in one of the states for Muslim Students to put on Hijab in Christian Mission Schools by the State Court. The Area has 4 States and 10 Zonal offices with 8 AFCS branches, 3 POSEC branches, FCS at secondary school, 74 and 4 functional JFCS branches at primary school level. South-West Area had 5 Corper Training Secretaries (CTS)/Volunteer Training Secretaries (VTS), a TS and then an Area Secretary who passed on 6th November, 2022. With the laudable support of the Associates and well-wishers the Area was able to 10 outreach visitations to FCS branches and 2 to Tertiary Institutions with 200 and 127 students reached respectively. 2 new FCS branches were inaugurated with 132 persons reached. 10 film shows organized with 574 students in attendance. 2 CTC held with 48 students' leaders in attendance.

One Bible quiz and camp meeting held with 19 and 65 students' participants. Also, 2 church awareness held with 227 persons in attendance in South West in 2022.


